Which Spanish class should I take?

SPAN 101

SPAN 101 is a practice-based language class focused on speaking the language through interactive storytelling with minimal emphasis on grammar and writing.

IF any or all of these apply, SPAN 101 is right for you:

- I've never taken a spanish language course
- I've taken high school Spanish but don't feel I speak or understand it well
- I want to focus on language acquisition

SPAN 203

In SPAN 203, we take the language skills you already have and build on them to improve reading, writing, and spelling (written accents, etc.)

- At home I spoke/speak Spanish with my family or use Spanish media
- Although I speak Spanish, I want to improve my reading, writing, and conversational abilities
- I have lived in a spanish speaking country for 1 year or more (mission or study abroad programs)
