MINUTES OF JANUARY 19, 1981 were approved as written on MOTION by Mr. Blastock. Affirmative vote unanimous.

TREASURER'S REPORT for January 1981, was accepted on MOTION by Dr. Lehrman.

DISBURSEMENTS included vouchers #1 through 300 and #500 through 600 totaling \$982,468.04; fund transfers covered by vouchers #304 through #309 were \$179,155.82.

January payrolls were: Regular \$406,874.25

Work/Study 9,368.03

A MOTION by Mr. Babcock approved the disbursements and the transfer of funds and acknowledged the January payrolls.

RESOLUTION: A resolution permitting the Business Manager to change the college checking accounts to interest bearing checking accounts, was approved on MOTION by Mr. Babcock. Affirmative vote unanaimous.

SCHOLARSHIPS AND LOANS: Four music scholarships and one Rangen Scholarship were approved on MOTION by Mr. Hamilton. Affirmative vote unanimous.

MR. & MRS. JAMES BONDURANT: Were given some time on the agenda.

MR. SAYER AND MR. STUTZMAN: Visited with the Board for a few minutes concerning cutbacks in the Rodeo Program.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT: Dr. Taylor expressed optimism that the Tuition Bill will pass in the state legislature; and also the Liquor Fund Bill that he has presented. The Liquor Fund Bill would require that counties mandated to be served by the junior college, would have 50% of their liquor fund money, which is now earmarked for tuition for their county students, sent directly to the College of Southern Idaho.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT Dr. Taylor indicated that much of his work is devoted (Cont'd) to the legislature at the present time. He is reviewing evaluations for the faculty and staff for re-employment.

The new vocational building is about 62% complete and the target date is May 28th.

The solor lab is near completion, and the fodder beet program is progessing in production of ethanol.
