MINUTES OF MARCH 19, 1984, were approved as written on MOTION by Dr. Scholes. Affirmative vote unanimous.

TREASURER'S REPORT for MARCH was accepted upon MOTION by Mr. Blastock. Affirmative vote unanimous.

DISBURSEMENTS included Vouchers #1 through #301 and #501 through #617 and #701 \overline{t} hrough #706 totaling \$253,268.29.

A MOTION by Dr. Scholes approved the disbursements and transfer of funds and acknowledged the March payrolls. Affirmative vote unanimous.

BUDGET:

A budget shift from administration to student personnel and resource development budget, according to the attached schedule was approved on MOTION by Dr. Scholes.

COMPUTER EXPANSION: The expansion of the current Hewlett-Packard computer system was approved on MOTION by Dr. Scholes with a total cost of \$138,584.43 to be taken from the plant facilities reserve fund.

LOANS AND SCHOLARSHIPS: Four loans totaling \$400 were approved on MOTION by Dr. Scholes.

RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT: Joan Edwards presented a written summation to the board of her internship with the National Council of Resource Development.

President Meyerhoeffer recommended to the board the issuing of CONTRACTS: contracts to all of those on the accompanying list and asked the board to approve salary increases of \$500 per person plus a 6 percent increase, and an additional 2 percent for those who had been recommended for merit from their respective deans. PRESIDENT'S REPORT: President Meyerhoeffer reported on the visit from the Northwest Accrediting Association team. He felt that they were generally impressed with our institution. He indicated that they had made the following three commendations and three recommendations. The three commendations were: high morale of faculty and students; high quality of education; and the relationship between college and the community exemplified the community college philosophy. The recommendations were as follows: better communication between vocational and academic components; review general education requirements; and a better followup on students. President Meyerhoeffer reported that he will appear before the commission on June 14, 1984 at 1 pm in Spokane to receive the recommendations of the accreditation team and to respond accordingly. He further reported that Jim Woods, director of our museum, has applied for national accreditation and that our auto mechanics program is also seeking national accreditation.

In continuing his report, he indicated that a survey of students who attended fall semester and did not return for the second semester had been conducted. He reported on the findings of that survey. A survey of students had also been made to determine the interest in girl's volleyball, but no recommendation will be made to the board for this fall.

1983-84 BUDGET

Due to a shift in emphasis during the current fiscal year it appears that both the Resource Development budget and the Student Personnel budget will be overspent for the year.

The Resource Development budget was set at only \$35,600.00 and will probably run approximately \$50,000.00. The Student Personnel budget will be less than 5% over or approximately \$12,000.00. Both of these budget over-expenditures are due to a complete revamping and change of direction for the two departments. The changes, however, have taken some pressure off of the administration budget for this year and there will be enough left in that budget to offset the other two.

The effect of new technology in data processing has been much more dramatic than we thought possible three or four years ago. As we analyze our present position we have made the following observations:

- 1. The proliferation of students in some types of computer training has been very dramatic. We can identify 3,058 students who receive some type of data processing training during the last year at CSI.
- 2. We have all of the Business Office records on the computer including payroll, budget, general journal, accounts payable, accounts receivable (including County billings) and inventory.
- 3. We hope to be ready for an on-line registration system by Fall and, within a reasonable period of time, have five years of student records on-line. Last Fall we purchased a student registration and records software package from Santa Rosa Community College for \$5,000.00. They are now marketing the same package for \$29,000.00.
- 4. Due to the demands on the present system we have already ordered a system expansion for approximately \$12,000.00 and are about out of disc space. A new disc drive would cost \$25,520.00 less the educational discount.
- 5. Timing on the purchase of an expanded system is important. We put together what we thought was needed and then discovered that Hewlett-Packard is offering the same package on a promotion that would save us over \$18,000.00. The cost for the two items in #4 above

of approximately \$37,000.00 is also included in the package. The package is as follows:

After much consideration and involvement of faculty, computer people and administration the following is recommended to the Board:

Purchase of Equipment from Hewlett-Packard	\$113,384.43
Payment of Idaho Com- puter Services (Ben Pratt) for the Series 33 Trade-in	13,000.00
Purchase of an Optical Scanner from National Computer Systems	12,000.00
TOTAL OF PAYMENTS to be taken from the Plant Facilities Reserve Fund	\$138,584.43

The above package should double the present machine capacity. It should divide instructional processing from administration processing. This would provide much better security for administration, payroll and student records. It would allow for the on-line registration system and retrieval of student records as outlined in item #3 above.

The Optical Scanner would allow us to electronically input grades into the system. It would also be used for scoring test results and for recording daily attendance as required by the Veterans Administration and State Vocational. It could be used for recording results from surveys, etc. or anything done on a form prepared for mark reading.
