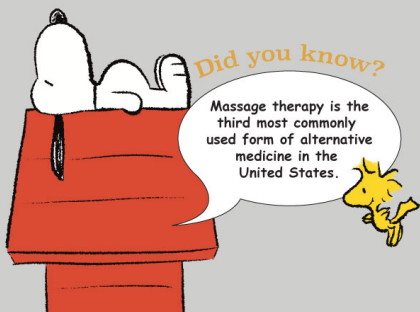

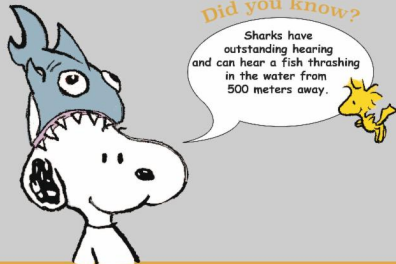

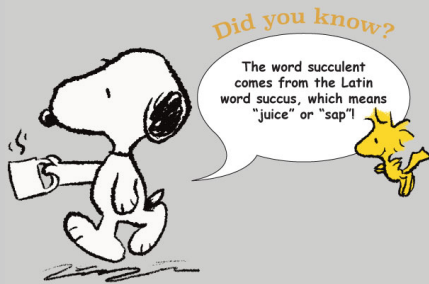

Friendship Soup

Ground beef 1 lb
Tomatoes 1 - 28 oz can
Onion 1 medium

Split peas ½ cup
Barley ¼ cup
Lentils ½ cup
Basil 1 tsp
Oregano 1 tsp
Rice ½ cup
Beef broth 12 cups (more if needed)

ABC's ½ cup

Cook ground beef and onion, drain. Add tomatoes, breaking them up into smaller pieces. Add dried ingredients, herbs and rice. Add beef broth. Bring to a boil, then reduce to a simmer for about 45 minutes. Add macaroni and continue cooking until peas, barley, lentil and macaroni are tender.

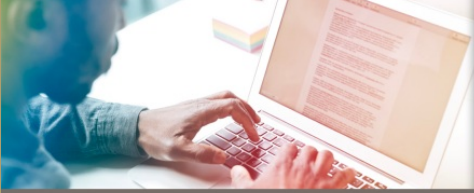


